Mana Saraghi, DMD, is a Board Certified Dentist Anesthesiologist. She received her undergraduate degree in biology from New York University, graduating summa cum laude and being inducted into Phi Beta Kappa. She then pursued her graduate degree at the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine. She completed her anesthesiology residency at the Jacobi Medical Center, in affiliation with the Albert Einstein College of Medicine, in New York City. After completing residency, Dr Saraghi started a private practice, providing anesthesia services in the dental office setting. Dr Saraghi is currently the Dental Anesthesiology Residency Program Director at Jacobi Medical Center and an Assistant Professor of Dentistry at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in the Bronx. Dr Saraghi provides sedation and anesthesia to a diverse patient population, including both children and adults, especially those who are dental phobic and/or medically compromised. Dr Saraghi's areas of professional interest include conducting clinical research on new therapeutic agents to reduce pain and anxiety in dentistry. She considers it a privilege to collaborate with her dental colleagues in the provision of safe sedation and anesthesia care and to share her knowledge.

Sedation and Anesthesia Update: Hot Button Topics

It comes as no surprise to the dental professional that sedation-related morbidity and mortality is a frequent topic of discussion in today's media. It remains to be seen whether this is attributable to a true increase in incidence or more frequent reporting. Regardless, patient selection is of utmost importance to identify high risk patients and ensure their optimization for office-based sedation or anesthesia. Such topics include patients with obesity, obstructive sleep apnea, asthma, cardiovascular disease, and implications for polypharmacy with anticoagulants, antidepressants, analgesics, and much more. In the wake of such events, state boards may opt to increase monitoring requirements as well and this presentation will discuss the merits of ventilatory monitors such as endtidal capnography and precordial stethoscopes. Another area of recent attention is the opioid crisis and this presentation will review multimodal analgesic techniques including local anesthetics, nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory agents, acetaminophen, ketamine, and opioids.

AED Rebate Program

Sim Man & Anesthesia Assistant Incentives
